Daniels Family Funeral Services is comprised of many funeral homes in the State of New Mexico. There are eight funeral homes in Albuquerque, Rio Rancho and Socorro and three beautiful cemeteries and two crematories in Albuquerque and Rio Rancho. Although there are a variety of job responsibilities, every employee of our company shares one common goal: to earn and maintain the trust our customers place in us.

Every individual's life is full of unique experiences and contributions to our society. Family members and friends all have personal and special memories of their loved ones. Our role is to assist and direct customers in commemorating the life of their loved one in such a way that creates a lasting memory for all who participate.

Our services are unique in that we serve families on what many times are the worst day of their lives. We acknowledge that people have a choice of which funeral provider they decide will care for their loved ones. Can I change any of these prepaid funeral services later?

Changes are possible, however, when changes are made, they often-times affect the terms of guarantees that were created under the original agreement. In the event funds paid toward a funeral plan are excludable resources for purposes of receiving social services (SSI or Medicaid), changing the terms of that agreement could jeopardize one's qualification for assistance. It is not recommended that irrevocably assigned funeral plans be changed in any way. Plans that are not irrevocably assigned can be changed at any time.

What if your funeral home or cemetery changes ownership?

Prior contractual agreements are not voided simply because a change of ownership occurs. The funeral planning agreement you have with the prior ownership is carried forward with successor owners as part of the purchase agreement.

Is there a pre-payment penalty for paying off these arrangements in advance?

It's not uncommon to have a small processing fee associated with an early payment, but it should not be construed as a "penalty." In the long run, there is usually a good amount of money to be saved by paying off early. Of course, funding agreements vary. Please be sure to check the terms of your (or your proposed) funding agreement for details.

Can social services take my pre-arrangements away from me?

Take away? No. Challenge the amount being set aside to pay for an expensive funeral? Yes. Funds set aside to pay for a reasonable funeral arrangement are not counted as assets as one qualifies for social services. Our Funeral Directors can provide counsel regarding the amount local social services agencies consider reasonable and customary to spend on a funeral.



Why should I prearrange my funeral or burial?

When you plan ahead, you will be able to compare the many options available. You will be able to compare the services, the products and the prices of the options of your choice. You will have the opportunity to make an informed decision about your funeral and cemetery arrangements, and the form of memorial you prefer. You will be able to make choices that are meaningful to both you and your family, and you will gain peace of mind knowing your family and friends will be relieved of the emotional and financial burden often associated with making arrangements when a death occurs. In addition, by prefunding your funeral and cemetery services, a guaranteed price contract will allow you to purchase at today's prices, free from inflationary pressures in the future. Our trained and licensed Family Service Counselors can answer any questions you may have and help you pre-plan.

If I pre-plan and prepay my funeral or burial, how do I know that the money will be there when I die?

If you decide to prepay your funeral or burial prearrangements, there are generally two methods to assure the funeral home's and/or cemetery's performance. Your money is either used toward a premium to purchase life insurance whereby the policy proceeds will pay for your arrangements, or your funds -- either the entire amount or a portion of them -- will be deposited into a trust fund account to defray the provider's costs. Either method should be disclosed to you and the contract should state whether or not the purchase price is guaranteed; that is, whether you or your family will have to pay additional amounts on the items you have selected in the contract. A guaranteed price contract means that no further payment will ever be required beyond the price stated in the contract for the items you are purchasing.

If I prepay my funeral, what happens to the interest that my money earns?

If you have a prearranged funeral or burial agreement that is comprised of items that are guaranteed to be performed by the funeral home or cemetery at no additional cost to you, the interest (or growth if a life insurance policy) is retained by the funeral home/cemetery to offset the rising costs of those specified goods and services over time. That's the value of prearranging and prefunding at today's costs!

counselor who will assist you in making all arrangements. Two to four hours should be allotted to make or review funeral arrangements, depending on the individuals making the arrangements, and the degree to which pre-planning was done. After all service decisions are complete, financial arrangements will be made.

Plan to bring the following for the funeral arrangements:

- Clothing items of your choice (formal or casual), if the service arrangements would require such. Shoes and/or a belt are optional.
- Parents' legal names (including mother's maiden name).
- Veteran Discharge paper, DD214 or equivalent, if applicable
- A recent photograph or your favorite picture
- Items to *personalize* the service, for example - special music, personal mementos, additional photos, etc.

Cemetery Arrangements

During your visit to the funeral home, the funeral director will contact the cemetery and make plans for you to visit to finish arrangements. When you meet with the cemetery personnel, you may need to provide legal documents denoting ownership of the cemetery property to be used.

Feel Free to Ask Any Questions

Since you do not make funeral arrangements everyday, it is normal to feel a little uncertain about what to do or even what to ask. Please, do not hesitate to ask questions, even if you think you should know the answer.



WHAT DO I DO?

What do I do?" is one of the most common questions asked by those who have just experienced the death of a family member or friend. The following information has been prepared as a guideline of things that need to be done during this difficult time.

Notification of Proper Authorities.

The proper authorities should be contacted immediately – such as hospice, emergency services, or physicians.

Initial Call to Funeral Home

After the appropriate authorities have pronounced the death, the funeral home should be contacted. We answer our telephones 24 hours, every day, even on weekends and holidays. Simply tell our staff that a death has occurred and you will be connected with someone who can assist you.

It is helpful if the following information can be provided:

- Full name of the deceased
- Location of the deceased
- Social Security number of the deceased
- Attending physician's name and office telephone number
- Name under which any pre-arrangements were made
- Permission to embalm (if applicable)
- Discuss an appointment time to visit the funeral home to complete arrangements. Even if pre-arrangements have been made, it is necessary to meet with the funeral director to review and complete arrangements.

First Visit to the Funeral Home

When you visit the funeral home for the arrangement conference, you will be introduced to a funeral director and a family service

However, any funeral arrangements you select will include a charge for our basic services and overhead. If legal or other requirements mean you must buy any items you did not specifically ask for, we will explain the reason in writing on the statement we provide describing the funeral goods and services you selected.

BASIC SERVICES OF THE FUNERAL DIRECTOR AND STAFF:

This fee for our basic services and overhead will be added to the total cost of the funeral arrangements you select. (This fee is already included in our charges for direct cremations, immediate burials, and forwarding or receiving remains.) This fee includes the following:

Personnel available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year to respond to initial call

Arrangement Conference

Coordinating service plans with cemetery, crematory, and/or other parties involved in the final disposition of the deceased

Clerical assistance in the completion of various forms and permits associated with a service

Also covers overhead, including facility maintenance, equipment and inventory costs, insurance and administration expenses, and governmental compliance

PREPARATION OF THE BODY:

Except in certain special cases, embalming is not required by law. Embalming may be necessary, however, if you select certain funeral arrangements, such as a funeral with viewing. If you do not want embalming, you usually have the right to choose an arrangement that does not require you to pay for it, such as direct cremation or immediate burial.

Burial and Plot-Interment Allowances (Cont.)

How Much Does VA Pay?

Service-Related Death. VA will pay up to \$2,000 toward burial expenses for deaths on or after September 11, 2001. VA will pay up to \$1,500 for deaths prior to September 10, 2001. If the veteran is buried in a VA national cemetery, some or all of the cost of transporting the deceased may be reimbursed.

Nonservice-Related Death. VA will pay up to \$700 toward burial and funeral expenses and a \$700 plot-interment allowance for deaths on or after December 1, 2001. The plot-interment allowance is \$150 for deaths prior to December 1, 2001. If the death happened while the veteran was in a VA hospital or under VA contracted nursing home care, some or all of the costs for transporting the veteran's remains may be reimbursed.

How Can You Apply?

You can apply by filling out VA Form 21-530, *Application for Burial Benefits*. You should attach a copy of the veteran's military discharge document (DD 214 or equivalent), death certificate, funeral and burial bills. They should show that you have paid them in full. Burial in a National Cemetery

Burial benefits available include a gravesite in any of our 125 national cemeteries with available space, opening and closing of the grave, perpetual care, a Government headstone or marker, a burial flag, and a Presidential Certificate, at no cost to the family. Some veterans may also be eligible for Burial Allowance. Cremated remains are buried or inurned in national cemeteries in the same manner and with the same honors as casketed remains.

Burial benefits available for spouses and dependent's buried in a national cemetery include burial with the veteran, perpetual care, and the spouse or dependents name and date of birth and death will be inscribed on the veteran's headstone, at no cost to the family. Eligible spouses and dependents may be buried, even if they predecease the veteran.



Burial and Plot-Interment Allowances

What Are VA Burial Allowances?

VA burial allowances are partial reimbursements of an eligible veteran's burial and funeral costs. When the cause of death is not service related, the reimbursements are generally described as two payments: (1) a burial and funeral expense allowance, and (2) a plot or interment allowance.

Who Is Eligible?

- *You may be eligible for a VA burial allowance if:*
- you paid for a veteran's burial or funeral, **AND**
- you have not been reimbursed by another government agency or some other source, such as the deceased veteran's employer, **AND**
- the veteran was discharged under conditions other than dishonorable.

In addition, at least one of the following conditions must be met:

- the veteran died because of a service-related disability, **OR**
- the veteran was receiving VA pension or compensation at the time of death, **OR**
- the veteran was entitled to receive VA pension or compensation, but decided not to reduce his/her military retirement or disability pay, **OR**
- the veteran died while hospitalized by VA, or while receiving care under VA contract at a non-VA facility, **OR**
- the veteran died while traveling under proper authorization and at VA expense to or from a specified place for the purpose of examination, treatment, or care, **OR**
- the veteran had an original or reopened claim pending at the time of death and has been found entitled to compensation or pension from a date prior to the date of death, **OR**
- the veteran died on or after October 9, 1996, while a patient at a VA-approved state nursing home.

FORWARDING REMAINS TO ANOTHER FUNERAL HOME:

If you want to arrange a direct cremation, you can use an alternative container. Alternative containers encase the body and can be made of materials like fiberboard or composition materials (with or without an outside covering). The containers we provide are alternative containers and other cremation containers, including containers made of wood, containers made of fiberboard, and containers made of other composite materials. See descriptions below. We also offer a selection of cremation oriented caskets.

Our charges for direct cremation (without ceremony) include transfer of remains, transportation to crematory, refrigeration, Basic services of staff and the Courier vehicle. The crematory fee is included.

Veterans Burial Flags

A United States flag is provided, at no cost, to drape the casket or accompany the urn of a deceased veteran who served honorably in the U. S. Armed Forces. It is furnished to honor the memory of a veteran’s military service to his or her country. VA will furnish a burial flag for memorialization for each other than dishonorable discharged



- veteran who served during wartime
- veteran who died on active duty after May 27, 1941
- veteran who served after January 31, 1955
- peacetime veteran who was discharged or released before June 27, 1950
- certain persons who served in the organized military forces of the Commonwealth of the Philippines while in service of the U.S. Armed Forces and who died on or after April 25, 1951
- certain former members of the Selected Reserves

Who Is Eligible to Receive the Burial Flag?

Generally, the flag is given to the next-of-kin, as a keepsake, after its use during the funeral service. When there is no next-of-kin, VA will furnish the flag to a friend making request for it. For those VA national cemeteries with an Avenue of Flags, families of veterans buried in these national cemeteries may donate the burial flags of their loved ones to be flown on patriotic holidays.

Can a Burial Flag Be Replaced?

The law allows us to issue one flag for a veteran's funeral. We cannot replace it if it is lost, destroyed, or stolen. However, some veterans' organizations or other community groups may be able to help you get another flag.



Military Burial with Daniels Family Funeral Services

All honorably discharged Veterans will receive a burial space at no cost in any of the three cemeteries owned by the Daniels Family Funeral Services. Veterans have the option of selecting burial spaces within the designated Veteran’s Garden alongside other Veterans or they may select burial spaces in any other garden of their choice. Unlike the VA Cemetery in Santa Fe, your children have the option of selecting their own burial spaces near you, keeping families together as well as honoring our Veterans.

Military Honors can be conducted at the burial site on the day and time your family chooses and there are no time restraints. On your behalf, we will request your Veterans Memorial which is provided to you by the VA at no charge.

Time is valuable. Choosing to be buried locally, in Albuquerque or Rio Rancho, eliminates the need to travel to Santa Fe for a visit.

All Veterans will receive a Presidential Certificate in honor of their service to our country.

HOW SOCIAL SECURITY HELPS FAMILIES

Social Security survivors benefits help ease the financial burden that follows a worker's death. Almost all children under age 18 will get monthly benefits if a working parent dies. Other family members may be eligible for benefits too. Anyone who has worked and paid Social Security (FICA) taxes has been earning Social Security benefits for his or her family. The amount of work needed to pay survivors benefits depends on the worker's age at the time of death. It may be as little as 1-1/2 years for a young worker. No one needs more than 10 years.

WHO CAN GET SURVIVORS BENEFITS?

Here is a list of family members who usually can get benefits:

- Widows and widowers age 60 or older.
- Widows and widowers at any age if caring for the deceased's child(ren) who are under age 16 or disabled.
- Divorced wives and husbands age 60 or older, if married to the deceased 10 years or more.
- Widows, widowers, divorced wives and divorced husbands age 50 or older, if they are disabled.
- Children up to age 18.
- Children age 18-19, if they attend elementary school or high school full time.
- Children over age 18, if they became disabled before age 22.
- The deceased worker's parents age 62 or older, if they were being supported by the worker.

A SPECIAL ONE-TIME PAYMENT

In addition to the monthly benefits for family members, a one-time payment of \$255 can be paid to a spouse who was living with the worker at the time of death. If there is none, it can be paid to:

- A spouse who is eligible for benefits.
- A child or children eligible for benefits.

This payment cannot be made if there is no eligible spouse or child.

HOW TO APPLY FOR BENEFITS

You can apply for benefits by telephone or by going to any Social Security office. You may need some of the documents shown on the list below. Don't delay your application because you don't have all the information. If you don't have a document you need, Social Security can help you get it.

INFORMATION NEEDED

- Your Social Security number and the deceased worker's Social Security number
- A death certificate. (Generally, the funeral director provides a statement that can be used for that purpose.)
- Proof of the deceased worker's earnings for the last year (W-2 forms or self-employment tax return).
- Your birth certificate
- A marriage certificate, if you are applying for benefits as a widow, widower, divorced wife, or divorced husband.
- A divorce decree, if you are applying for benefits as a divorced wife or husband.
- Children's birth certificates and Social Security numbers, if applying for children's benefits.

You will need to submit original documents or copies certified by the issuing office. You can mail or bring them to the office. Social Security will make photocopies and return your documents.

SUPPLEMENTAL SECURITY INCOME (SSI)

If you are 65 or older, disabled, or blind ask the Social Security representative about Supplemental Security Income (SSI) checks for people with limited income and resources. If you receive SSI, you may also qualify for Medicaid, food stamps, and other social services.

A REMINDER

If the deceased was receiving Social Security benefits, any checks which arrive after death will need to be returned to the Social Security office. If Social Security checks were being directly deposited into a bank account, the bank needs to be notified of the death too.

Your funeral director is helping the Social Security office by giving you this information about Social Security benefits. If the deceased was receiving benefits, you need to contact us to report the death. If you think you may be eligible for survivors benefits, you should contact us to apply.
